CASHIERS are needed in a home improvement store run by an agency that builds homes for the needy; must be able to operate the cash register, take payments and make change for customers. Contact Sue.

CRAFT INSTRUCTOR -teach knitting, crocheting and other crafts to adults at a senior center. Times needed: Monday or Tuesday from 10:00 a.m.-12 or 12:30-3:00 p.m.. Contact Nadine.
