The Benefits of Volunteering



Many people don't realize the impact of volunteering. They think it is just a nice thing to do-which it most definitely is - but it also has a wide impact. Volunteerism instills a sense of community and promotes civic engagement; volunteers provide great benefit to the agencies where they serve; and volunteerism also directly benefits the volunteer. Each year we conduct a variety of surveys to gather information from our partner agencies and volunteers. A few pieces of data from some recent surveys indicate the following impact:

96% of our partner agencies stated that Greater Cleveland Volunteers' members help their agency accomplish their mission and serve the community.

98% of tutors in our AARP Experience Corps program said that volunteering increased their sense of purpose in life and 99% reported that volunteering helped them stay physically and mentally active.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

We provide a brief description with the Greater Cleveland Volunteers' contact person listed. Phone numbers and emails are below

After School Programs: Become a Tutor, Reading Buddy or Homework Helper. East and West Locations available. Lynette.

Beauty Salon Assistant: Transport senior living facility residents to and from salon in the building, visit with residents while waiting for their appointment, sweep and perform other tasks as requested. Tuesdays and /or Wednesdays between 9:15 a.m.to 4:15 p.m. Background Check mandatory. Lynette.

Boutique Helper: East side agency for homeless families in transition needs a volunteer to help in its boutique once or twice a week. Assist customers, maintain displays and help with purchases. Sue.

Breast Cancer Survivor Mentor: Must have completed last breast cancer treatment at least one year ago. Mentor newly diagnosed patients with information and resource referrals in person, over the phone or by email. Training provided. Nadine.

Disaster Services: Serve as a member of a team that responds to local disasters; such as dwelling fires, weather related emergencies and others to determine the immediate needs of individuals and families such as; shelter, food, clothing and other necessary items. Volunteers choose their shifts in advance as it suits their schedule. Sue.

Food Pantry: Volunteers are needed at Westside food pantry Mondays or Fridays from 10:00 a.m.until 2:00 p.m. to assist with packing and delivery of food bags. Jan.

Information Desk: A downtown science center lis ooking for volunteers to staff the information desk for a 4-5 hour shift once a week. For month of **August only, Tues-Sun from 11-5.** September to October weekends only from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. A background check is required. Free parking and discount in café and gift shop. Nadine.

Mentor College Students: Volunteers are needed to work with high achieving, low income students in 10th-12th grades, who are the first members of their families to attend college. Volunteers are paired with a student and provide one-on-one ACT tutoring in math, verbal or both. May also help student complete applications, essays, find financial aid, etc. All volunteers must have a 4-year college degree. Sue.

Mentor Youth: Become a big brother or big sister to a child 6 to 18 years of age. East and West side opportunities available. Valid Ohio Driver's License, reliable car, and background check all mandatory. Lynette.

Resume Writing: Assist students ages 15-18 in creating resumes using a template. No resume building experience necessary and training is provided. Times and days are flexible. Locations will vary with training sites. Jan.

SATISFACTION SURVEY RESULTS

You might recall our satisfaction survey that we sent out in early 2015. We thank those volunteers and partner agency staff that completed and submitted the document. We truly appreciate your feedback. The information is shared with staff and Board members so that our programs can continue to improve and meet the needs of the community.

We are pleased to be able to report that:

96% of volunteers started **they are satisfied** with the services provided by Greater Cleveland Volunteers

Over 65% of volunteers stated they are interested in done in a day volunteer activities, to improve their satisfaction as a volunteer
