

Our Organization

Greater Cleveland Volunteers connects people with opportunities to serve others. We recruit, place, and support 1,800 volunteers at more than 100 nonprofit agencies in northeast Ohio. The work done by these men and women affects thousands of people in our community — people of all ages, races, ethnicities, and abilities. Volunteers help children learn how to read; comfort patients at hospitals; deliver meals to homebound seniors; assist homeless veterans; prepare food at hunger centers; and engage in many other civic activities.

Our agency began in 1972 as a small program within the Cleveland Department of Health. It grew to become a separately incorporated nonprofit supported by Federal and State dollars as well as by private contributions.

We have occupied office space in various locations with the Midtown neighborhood. In March 2013 we moved to our current address.



The new space features

- 4,000 square-foot office space on the second floor
- Natural lighting throughout the length of the suite, from east-facing windows
- Updated workstations (or private offices) for each of our 17 employees

This move provides an opportunity to support Greater Cleveland Volunteers’ work by making a financial contribution. Many spaces within our new location are available for naming and dedication.

Volunteerism is recognized as a powerful, cost-effective approach to addressing social needs. For each dollar invested, Greater Cleveland Volunteers is able to return a value of \$4.50 in actual service provided. One of our volunteers recently summarized this impact by noting,

- \$20,000** is the cost of providing 10 **AARP Experience Corps** tutors to one Cleveland school for one school year

- \$2,000** helps provide volunteers to deliver **Meals on Wheels** to seniors in 15 municipalities
- \$1,000** gives a child a lunchtime **mentor** for one day each week for an entire school year
- \$500** enables us to reach out to an area **veteran in need** of food, shelter and clothing

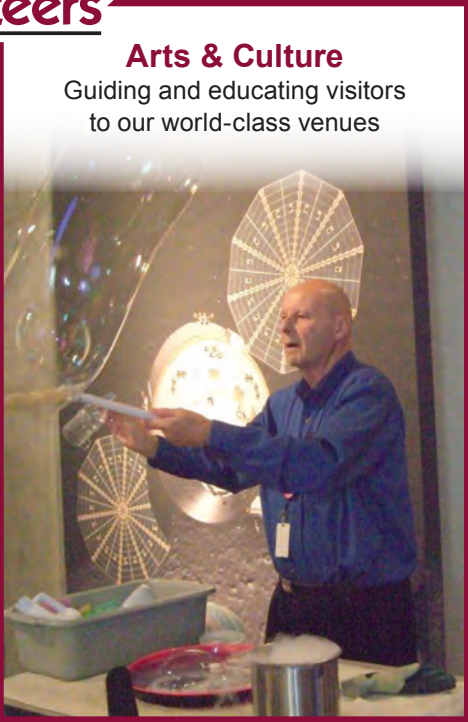
