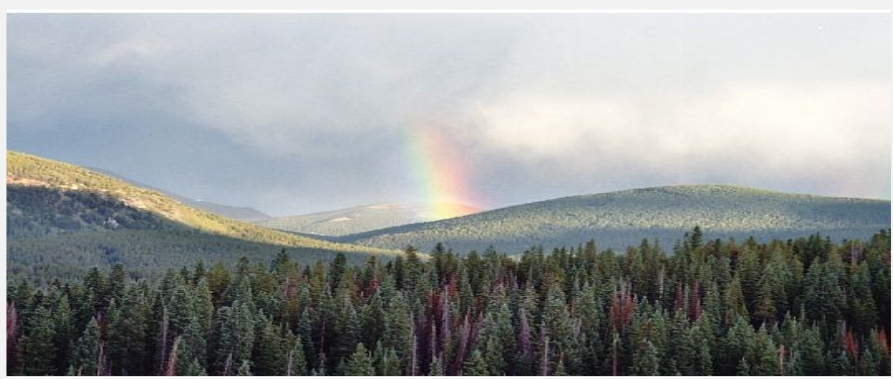


# Over the Rainbow
